History: The Anglo Saxons

Activities

- Write a poem to describe an Anglo Saxon Warrior or King. Try to use alliteration, descriptive lists, similes and collective nouns
- Write a secret message in Anglo-Saxon runes
- Draw a series of maps of the UK to show how regions and place names have changed since the Anglo Saxon times
- Build a 3D model (A4-A3 size) of an Anglo-Saxon settlement. Include houses, farms and the main hall

Activities

- Melt chocolate and butter to make chocolate crispy cakes and keep a photo or picture diary
- Make ice cubes, ice lollies or home-made ice cream and keep a photo or picture diary
- Observe how clothes dry on the line in the sun
- Mix bicarbonate of soda with vinegar to observe what happens
- Make a cake or bake bread to observe the chemical change and keep a photo or picture diary
