Dear parents/carers

Re: Fundraising for 2020-21

I felt it would be useful to, once again, set out the fundraising that we intend to do this year. Whilst we want to continue to raise money for local and national charities, with the ever-increasing funding issues that schools are facing, including the lack of fundraising from March-July 2020 due to school closure, fundraising for the school continues to be essential to enable us to provide the high quality experiences and resources that the pupils deserve. However, I am ever mindful of relying on everyone's goodwill with this, particularly at a time when some families will be experiencing financial pressures due to COVID-19 related work restrictions. I would like to reassure you that your child will not be disadvantaged if you are unable, or choose not to, support the fundraising that we do. As always, we are extremely grateful to those who are able to, so thank you in advance for your support.

Sponsored events

We will be organising three sponsored events this year, one each term. Money raised will continue to be used to further develop the school facilities and grounds, particularly providing more shaded areas, plus purchase resources to enhance all areas of the curriculum, with a particular focus on upgrading technology to support learning in the classroom.

- Harvest collection: donations for Tapestry Care UK
- #Hello Yellow: donation to wear yellow to support young people's mental health on World Mental Health Day
- Children-in-Need: donation to wear non-uniform
- Red Nose Day: donation to wear non-uniform
- Y6 mini market: variety of stalls for children to enjoy, with funds raised spent on something for the school that the Y6 children choose.
